

OBITUARY

MRS. ALICE VIRGINIA EDWARDS (nee SCOTT)

was born on Sunday, December 16, 1894 in Georgetown, Kentucky. She was one of 7 children of Nick and Edmonia Lee Scott. A brother, Lafon Scott, Blanchester, Ohio, is the sole survivor of the 4 sisters and 2 brothers.

Mrs. Edwards completed her education in the Public Schools of Georgetown, Kentucky and subsequently married the late Rev. William D. Edwards on Saturday, October 16, 1915. They settled in Indianapolis a year later and to this union were born 8 children, all of whom survive her. She dedicated her life to her family, as a loving and loyal wife and mother, uniquely concerned about the care and nurture of family, especially children. She became a foster mother of the late Lois Jeanne Harrell Johnson, and later served as a foster mother for the Marion County Welfare Department in the early 1940's. Mrs. Edwards, early in life embraced Christianity as a member of First Baptist Church, Georgetown, Kentucky, and later affiliated with the First Baptist Church of North Indianapolis. She has been a faithful member of Mt. Helm Missionary Baptist Church for 38 years, where her late husband was Pastor and Pastor Emeritus.

Mrs. Edwards was active for many years with the Interdenominational Ministers Wives Alliance, serving in the capacity of Treasurer. She was active (until recently) with the National Association of Ministers Wives, The Woman's Convention of the National Baptist Convention, Inc., the Union District Association, the General Missionary Baptist State Convention, Inc. a Charter Member of the Christian Woman's Outlook Club, and elder Member of the Cleveland Park Block Club.

Widely known for her sharp and ready sence of humor, charitable activity and philosophy, Mrs. Edwards exemplified a Christian humanist. She will be sadly missed by her 8 children, William N., Virginia M. Franklin, Juanita Alexander, Nathaniel S., Robert L., James E., Anna E. Meadows, and Dorothy L. Thorne, Cleveland, Ohio; a brother, Iafon Scott; 15 grand-children; 17 great grandchildren; a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, neighbors and friends.
