Read of Judge S. Williams this hundred & fifty Dollars in full
Payment for a certain Negro Woman named late aged
Thirty six years which Woman I do hereby warrant to
be sound and well as also by these presents I do bind
my self my heirs and assigns lawfully and lawfully to
warrant and defend her right to the said William
his heirs and assigns forever In witness whereof I do
hereby set my hand and affix my seal This 7th Decr 1781.

Dr Sir

Enclosed I send you twenty
dollars \$19.50 of which was a collection taken
up (to aid in the cause of Colonization in Africa)
at the Methodist Church in 1833. It would
have been forwarded earlier, but the person
in whose hands it was deposited was expected
that it would be immediately appropriated to
aid in sending the emigrants from this place
about as arrangements were made from a
different source, it is now sent on to be
lent to the members of the Col. Society.

One of the Negroes left by Elder to be sent to
Africa is still here (or rather in Richmond) & he
remains for the purpose of raising a sum of
money sufficient to purchase his wife and
two children, the motives were very commendable
but there may be some doubts about the
policy of the cause -

please let me know if any ship with
emigrants will be sent out this fall
