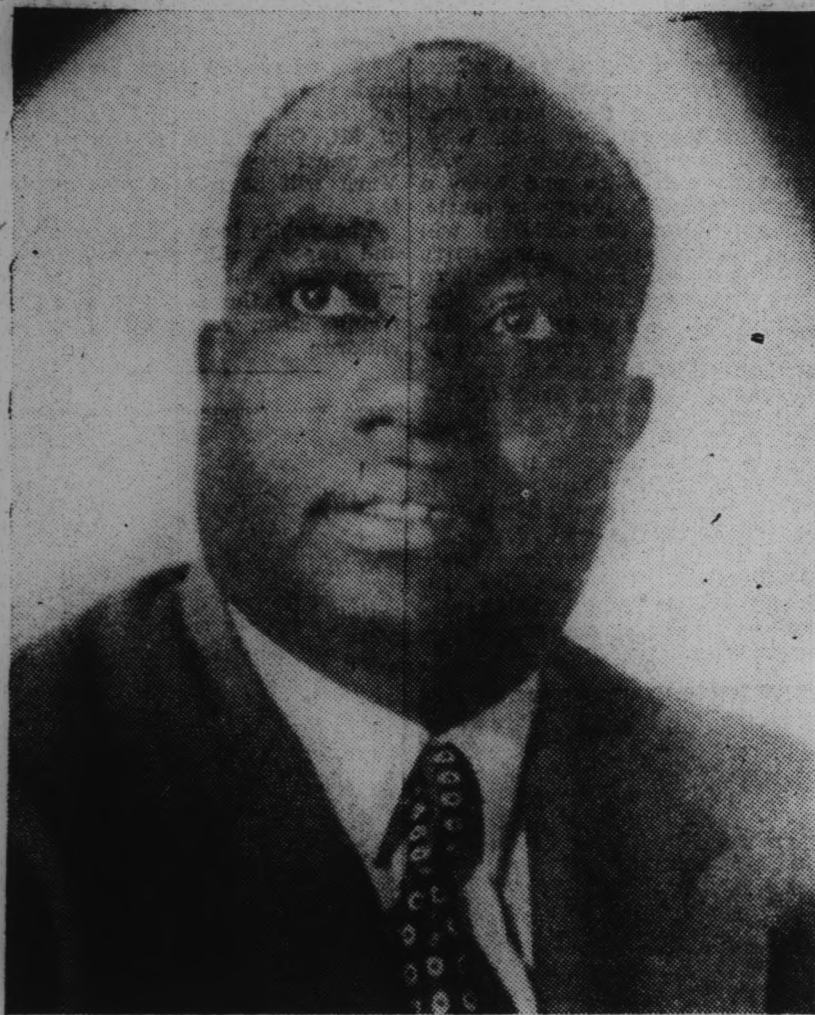


17th Street and Eastern Star Pastors To Exchange Pulpits Sunday Morning

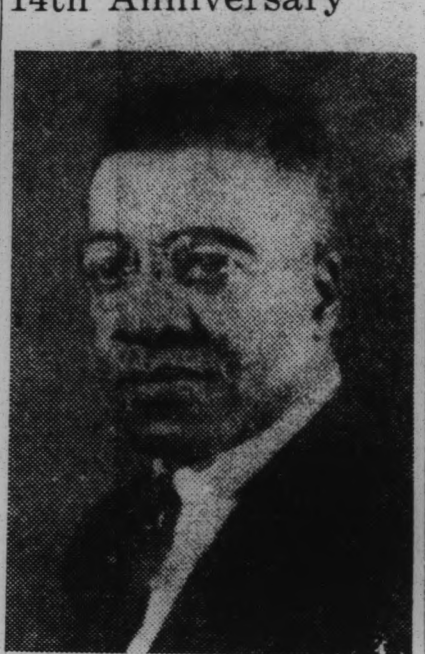

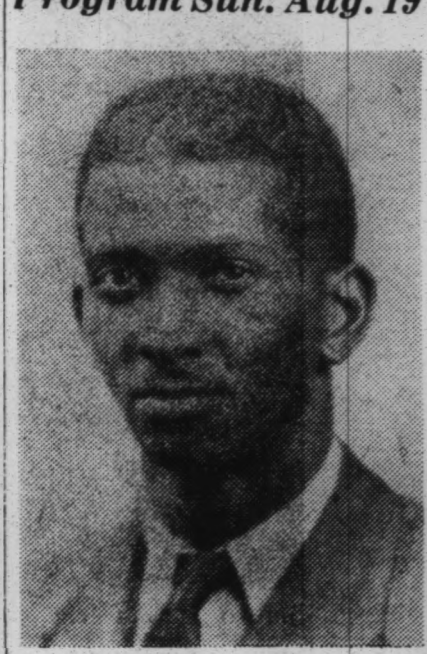
Mrs. Leon Bryant Hayes In Annual Program At 17th Street Baptist

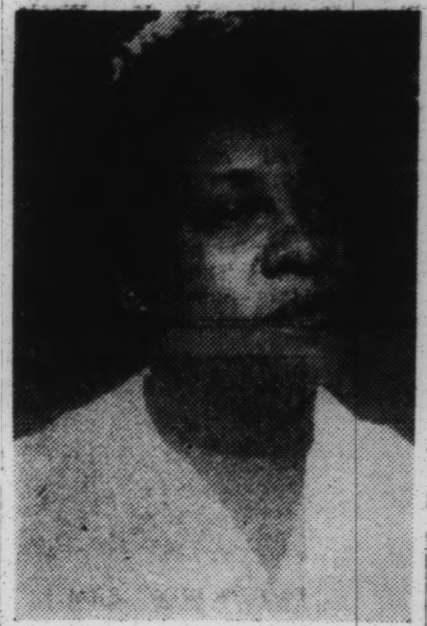
