A welcome home banquet for Bishop Arthur W. Womack of the Eighth Episcopal District C. M. E. Church, and Dr. M. L. Breeding on their return from a recent visit in Europe and Africa was scheduled to be held at Phillips Temple C. M. E. Church, Drake and West streets, Friday evening.

Bishop Womack, a resident of Indianapolis, was pastor of Phillips Temple in former years. Dr. Breeding, new pastor of Phillips Temple, recently pastored a church in Cleveland. Both churchmen attended the Methodist Ecumenical Conference at Oxford, England, Aug. 28 to Sept. 7.

Bishops Womack and Bertram W. Doyle of the C. M. E. Church and Bishop John A. Gregg of the A. M. E. Church flew to Africa from the conference at Oxford. The C. C. E. Church visited Accra, capital of the Gold Coast, and spent about 16 days touring the colony. Other points they visited included Somanya, Assesawa, Obossey, and Okai.

They baptized many converts to C. M. E. Church visited Accra, caped and six deacons on their missionary trip, which was commissioned by the General Conference of the C. M. E. Church.

## N.C.U. Chancellor Insists on Grid Games' Jimcrow

CHAPEL HILL, N. C. (ANP) — In the face of mounting student opposition, Robert B. House, chancellor of the University of North Carolina, last week stood firm on his decision to segregate Negro students at home football games at the university.

Chancellor House told representatives of 10 student organizations during a two-hour session that their resolutions protesting against segregation of six Negro students had not changed his ruling.

However, he did tell the group he would be glad to pass the resolutions along to Gordon Gray, president of the university, for his consideration when he returns from Washington.

Most of the resolutions pointed out that the action of the university administration, which offered the Negro students seats in the section reserved for colored people, was based on racial prejudice

and was "not in keeping with the Christian doctrine of the dignity of fellow students."

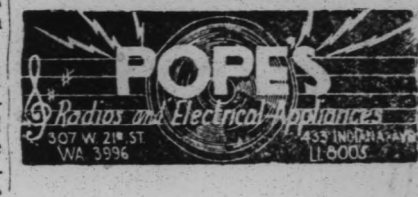
