Karamu Quartet At Second Christian On October 30th



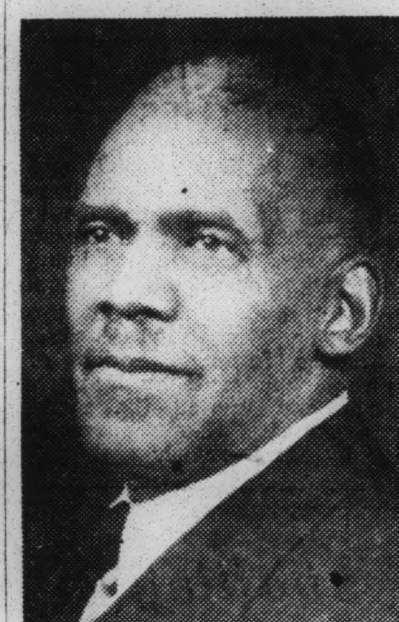

25th Anniversary of Rev. G. W. Evans of Fall Creek Baptist

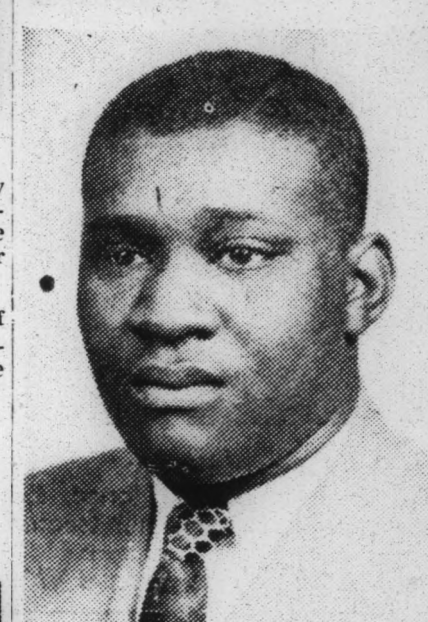

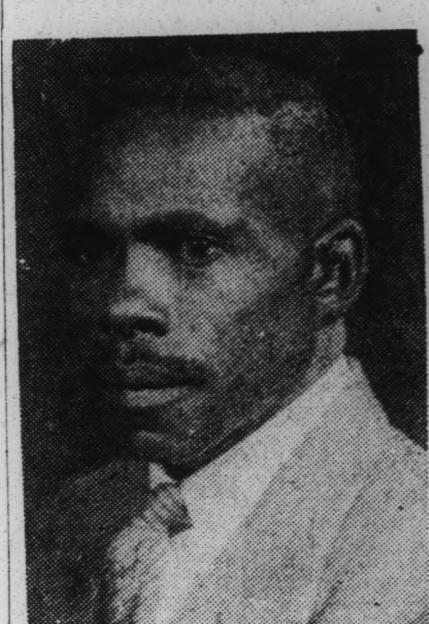

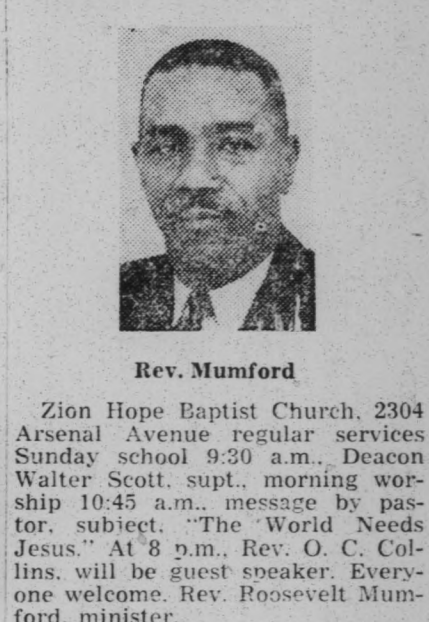
