Because of his progressive spirit the church has benefited from all of these accomplishments with a spiritual fervency and a numerical progress. The ministerial staff has grown and integrated into the total program of the church under the prayers and guidance of this young shepherd.

Rev. and Mrs. Cummings have been a valuable asset to the church and the congregation is very proud to have had them as their leader in a job "Well Done." Together they form a picture of enriched Christian stewardship which is manifested in the unity of the church. The public is cordially invited to attend these services. 


1st Women's Day Observance At Greater Christian
