Ga. SNCC Head At ISAC Meet

John Lewis, militant leader of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee currently conducting civil rights demonstrations in Atlanta, Ga., will arrive in Indianapolis Saturday to address a noon luncheon at the Severin Hotel, commemorating Negro History Week.

Members of the Indianapolis Social Action Council (ISAC) and other civil rights advocates will hear Lewis speak on his experiences in the South.

On a two-day visit here Lewis will meet with ISAC officials to discuss various methods of eliminating discrimination.

The luncheon program also includes a dramatization of three outstanding events in Negro History by the Laderson Players. They are portrayed as the organization of the NAACP in 1909, the Atlanta Exposition founders of speech by Booker T. Washington Tuskegee Institute, the beginning of sit-ins and the Montgomery (Ala.) boycott in 1958.
