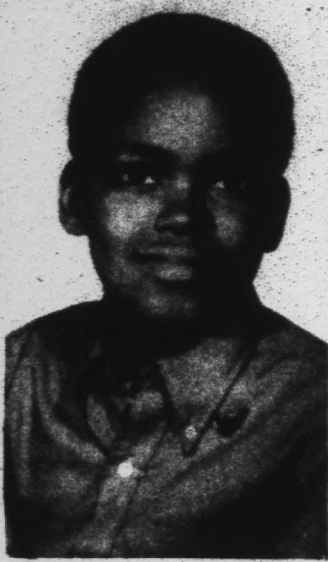

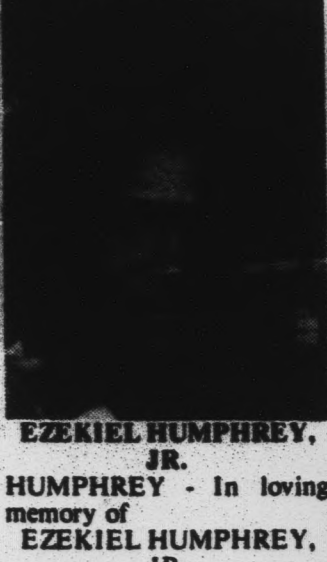
JAMES McDOWELL
