### HISTORY

# "The Continuing Story of First Baptist Church 1885 North Indianapolis" 1997

From the beginning, First Baptist Church was "rooted in prayer" since the service to God actually started as a Prayer Band which met at the various homes of interested persons. The church was organized in 1885 in the home of the Founder, the late John Jones, Sr. Rev. Richard Bassett was the first Pastor.

Deacon Jones was born a slave in Rangewood, North Carolina in 1844. He was set "free" in 1865 at the age of 21 by an act of the Civil War, and came to Indianapolis, Indiana. Though unable to read or write, he became one of the city's successful businessmen. His obedience and faith in God rewarded him with great wisdom and foresight, thus he became the founder of the John Jones & Sons Sand & Gravel Company. Much of his wealth was given to the church, and he was blessed throughout his entire life.

Deacon Jones and his wife, Eliza, were the first and second "charter members" of First Baptist Church. Other charter members were: Laura Montague Elizabeth Ray, William Ray, Katie Miller, John Miller, Harry Webb, Jennie Webb, Sallie Goodrich, William P. Austin, John Francis, Nellie Francis, Mary Richardson, Alexander Richardson, M. Ferdinand, Martha Moss, Joseph Stockton, Jasper Jones, Mrs. Cargory, Henry English, Hattie English, and Laura Sassman. Mrs. Laura Montague, who dide on Tuesday, August 21, 1962, at the age of 102 years, was the last surviving charter member. First Baptist was first located at Edgemont and Rader streets. In 1921, a new church was built at 980 Burdsal Parkway. After continued growth, the church purchased the Seventh Christian Church at 877 Udell on May 27, 1951.

Throughout the years, a strong family structure has been a defining characteristic of First Baptist. Even though it has now been 112 years since First Baptist was founded, grandchildren, greatgrandchildren and many other relatives of those founding charter members are still active in the congregation today!

Among the Pastors in the early years were Rev. A. Simmons, Rev. Robert Gregory, Rev. Peter Ferguson and Rev. J.C. Dunn, Rev. Frank Fernando Young became Pastor in 1907 and led the growth of First Baptist throughout many changes for over 50 years. His by-word, "IT'S IN THE BOOK", will always be a confirmation of his unshaken faith in God's spoken word. After serving his flock for 60 consecutive years, Rev. F.F. Young went to his reward on Sunday, September 10, 1967 at the age of 94 years old. His memory is still evident in the community as a nearby park is named after him. It is located at Udell and Rader Streets a few blocks from the present location of First Baptist. The Fellowship Hall located in the basement of our current sanctuary is also named for our former pastor.

Rev. Young's daughter, Sister Naomi Taborn, is currently the oldest living member of First Baptist at 94 years old. Through the grace of God, she attends very regularly and is still an inspiration to other members throughout the congregation.

Following the death of Dr. Young, Deacon Roscoe Harkins, Chairman of the Board, called a meeting presided over by Dr. J.T. Highbaugh, a member of First Baptist Church, and Pastor of Good Samaritan Baptist Church. A "Putpit Committee" was elected and formed consisting of Earl White, Sr., Susie Batie, Martha White, Roscoe Harkins, William R. Thurman, Mary Garvin, Warner Fitts, John Winters, Jr., and Joe Black, St.

On Monday, March 4, 1968, a special meeting was called, presided over by State Moderator, Dr. F. Benjamin Davis, Pastor of New Bethel Baptist Church. After hearing several possible candidates, only one was voted on and extended the call to guide the future hopes and aspirations of First Baptist Church, North Indianapolis.

On Friday, March 22, 1968, Rev. James R. Bradley, Sr. of Braddock, Pennsylvania, accepted the call to become Pastor of First Baptist Church, North Indianapolis, and on Sunday, June 9, 1968, Rev. Bradley came to stay, having finished or fulfilled his commitments in Pennsylvania.

Tuesday, July 9, 1968, was our Pastor's first engagement (13th Anniversary of the College Ave. Baptist Church. Rev. Otis Armistead—Pastor). College Avenue Baptist is now named Oasis of Hope Missionary Baptist Church. Rev. Armistead is currently an Associate Minister at First Baptist.

The Installation Service for Rev. Bradley was held on Sunday, July 21, 1968. Rev. Bradley's father, Rev. R.B. Bradley was the speaker for the morning service. He was then Pastor of Growing Valley Baptist Church in Longview, Texas. Dr. F. Benjamin Davis of New Bethel Baptist was the speaker for the afternoon service. The evening service featured Rev. C.T. Vivian of Chicago, Illinois, who was the Director of Urban Training Center of Christian Missions. It was truly a wonderful day.

As a tribute to the continuing, history of First Baptist, a Candlelight Service in honor of and in memory of Elder F.F. Young and all of the deceased members of First Baptist was held on September 29,1968 chaired by Mrs. Flossie Buchanan.

#### SPIRITUAL UPLIFTING

Reaching people to become followers of Christ has been central to Rev. Bradley's ministry. The continuation of an upward "Spiritual Thrust" to serve the present age is one of Pastor Bradley's significant accomplishments. Through the 29 years as Pastor of First Baptist, there was an addition of many new members either as candidates for baptism or through Christian experience.

From the early days of his pastorage throughout the years, one of the songs which Rev. Bradley often sang himself was "My Father Watches Over Me". The words...! I trust in God wherever 1 may be, Upon the land or on the rolling sea, For come what may, from day to day, My heav'nly Father watches oner me. I trust in God, I know He cares for me. On mountain bleak or on the stormy sea. Though billows roll, He keeps my soul, my heavenly Father watches over me. God watched over First Baptist and Pastor Bradley during the 29 years.

Immediately upon joining First Baptist, Rev. Bradley would encourage every member to develop a love and loyalty to the church. He emphasized how prayer is important in the life of every Christian. Just as First Baptist started as a Prayer Band, the reaffirmation of that focus has been continual.

In an effort to maintain contact with all members of the congregation, a shepherding plan was instituted. Led by the Deacons, this is intended to be a systematic plan for visiting, helping, learning the Scriptures, fellowshipping, socializing, evangelizing, and nurturing the congregation.

During "The Bradley Years" at First Baptist, the church witnessed the ordination of 11 Deacons, the ordination of one minister and the licensing of eight associate ministers.

#### MISSIONS

First Baptist has a long history of being involved in mission work. The church missionary body stimulates growth in witnessing and working to help others in the church and community. As far back as 1936, First Baptist assisted with mission work in Liberia, West Africa. Missionaries on the field at this time were Mr. & Mrs. Ervin. After being in the mission field for over 20 years, Mrs. Letha Ervin returned with her adoped daughter, Margo, a 12 year old Liberian girl. Margo Brooks grew up in First Baptist and the church assisted in the care of the retired missionary, Mrs. Ervin and Margo.

In 1972, early in Rev. Bradley's pastorage, First Baptist supported the Bitenne Family in Cap Hatien, Haiti. The church proper supported nine of the eleven children. Two individual families in First Baptist, The Ellison's and Burrus' supported two children. The children were educated and became professional people who contribute to the improvement of their country. The eldest, Rev. Jeanne Etienne, is a Pastor and President of the Haitian Baptist Mission Convention. There are nurses, secretaries and

Through the National Baptist Convention of America, the Indiana State Baptist Convention and Capitol City Convention, First Baptist has supported the planting of churches, schools and clinics over a wide area. In 1976, Rev. Bradley strongly encouraged the church to support one of our own members, who grew up and was trained in our congregation, to be a missionary overseas.

Barbara A. Graves-Oyewo, a trained nurse, was sent to Cameroon, West Africa to help establish a health center and to help spread the gospel in that community. She received continuous support for approximately three years while at the Dorcas-Luke Health Centre in Lysoka, Cameroon.

#### Home Missions and Outreach

Ministering to the needs of church and community members from youth to senior citizens is part of the effort to be dedicated to a lifelong program of growth and service.

On a regular basis during Rev. Bradley's tenure, First Baptist has provided food to the needy through the maintenance of a Food Pantry. The Dorcas Room located in the Educational Building has helped to provide free clothing to community members in need.

The First Baptist Senior Citizens were organized in 1969 with Ella Hart as President. First Baptist also provided space for a Lunch Program for senior citizens. The senior citizens group saved stamps which were helpful in purchasing the first church bus. The bus ministry has grown and has enabled the church to assist in the church transportation needs of members from all over Indianapolis as well as being utilized for senior citizens shopping trips and transporting youth and auxiliary groups for various religious and civic activities.

Outreach programs at First Baptist during Rev. Bradley's leadership period have been wide-ranging. The church sponsored a "Home for Girls" who were under the criminal justice system jurisdiction. The home was located on the corner of Annette & Udell. The COURAGE PROGRAM, a state supported program seeking to decrease teen pregnancies and involving family participation is currently a significant part of the outreach effort of First Baptist. The program encourages sex abstinence and seeks to develop male and female personal responsibility and awareness.



While First Baptist had originally established a building fund prior to Pastor Bradley's arrival, he promoted it heavily and the congregation responded appropriately. Groundbreaking for a new church sanctuary was in 1977. The Building Fund Committee was very active. During the year of the groundbreaking, it was chaired by Sis. Mary Frances Allen. Other members included Luima Burrus. Augusta Cosby, Scott Hicks, James Buchanan III, Ethel Bratton, Harriet Cheetam, Virgil Jones, Doris Jones, Rose Mitchell and Ethel Tate, who were loyal unto their deaths. Also among the committee were Samuel Barnett, Clara Biven, Dorothy Black, Joe Black, Clarice Hayden, Linda Jones, Marguerite Quarles, Dazell Smith, Marie Gray Thomas, Robertine Wells, Carlena Williams, Helen Williams, Nadine Hayes, Sarah Webb and J.C. Davis. They have all remained very active members.

Construction on the new building progressed in 1978 and the congregation marched into the new sanctuary located on 28th and Annette on Sunday, April 1, 1979. The cornerstone laying services were held on June 17, 1979, "an occasion of historic significance." As part of the process, some renovation was done to the old building on Annette and Udell including adding brick to the gymnasium and razing the old sanctuary for more parking availability. A short time later in 1983, we had a mortgage burning celebration signifying that the debt for the new building was paid. In the late 80's, more progress occurred during the Completion and Renovation stage and a balcony was added to the sanctuary and other needed improvements to both buildings were made.

Always a visionary. Rev. Bradley continued to encourage First Baptist to consider the tuture and prepare to solidify the growth of the congregation and expand our role in the community. He initiated the establishment of a long-range planning committee. For the past several years the committee has been carefully researching and planning for the future, considering the church's spiritual, physical and program and activity needs as we move toward the new millentium. The property acquisition committee has gradually expanded the church's holdings that may serve First Baptist and the community for future needs.

From celebrating its centennial 100th Anniversary in 1985 to the 105th in 1990, a similar theme has been present...."OUR HELP IN AGES PAST. OUR HOPE FOR YEARS TO COME," Ephesians 3:20,21. The theme which First Baptist had for the cornerstone laying celebration in 1979. "BUILDING FOR GENERATIONS" Psalm 48:11-14 and Psalm 78:6-7 again is reflective of the commitment that Rev. Bradley and the members of First Baptist have in continuing to spread the gospel through all nations!

As the Pastor, Rev. Bradley shared in the highs and lows in the life and times of the individual members and families of the congregation. He has been there for an untold number of weddings, anniversaries, baby blessings, family reunions and other significant happy events. He will be well remembered for the number of times that he personally called many members of the congregation on Thanksgiving, Christmas or New Year's Day. He will be remembered for the special fellowships and worship services with other churches and denominations within Indianapolis as well as around the state and nation.

While there are many pictures and memories which treasure the good moments, Rev. Bradley probably excelled even more when his presence was needed during sad times. His comforting spirit and soothing demeanor during the many funeral services showed a caring and compassionate minister who could help make the moment more manageable and touch the lives of the affected families. As Rev. Bradley said, "It hasn't always been an easy journey, but the scripture lets us know that our sojourn would not always be to our liking. But He promised to be with us in the good times and the bad times."

The bad times did not escape the Pastor either. On numerous occasions over the years, Rev. Bradley had to struggle with illness himself. He and his innmediate family had sorrow in the loss of his son James, Jr. in 1982, his father Rev. R.B. Bradley in 1984 and his son Carl in 1990. There were other times that other relatives of he and Mrs. Bradley have passed away. Throughout all of his struggles, he still showed a strong determination to preach the Gospel and build the Kingdom of God.

#### Youth Interests

Anyone ever witnessing the long line of children waiting outside Pastor Bradley's office after morning service on Sunday's realizes that he must have made a great impact with them...even if it was the candy connection! Many, many children (and adults also) have known where to go for sweetness which included candy, a kiss or handshake and kind, caring and encouraging words. Pastor Bradley has stated how much of a joy it is to see the once "Golden Nuggets" and "youth" now as young adults taking their rightful place in the church, carrying out the work of the Lord.

Youth Activities, primarily through the Youth Fellowship, have been one of the stronger components of the First Baptist ministry. Sister Martha White was the long-time sponsor of the Youth Fellowship. In recent years, Sister Donna McCray has been the youth director and has achieved much success for the participants in the youth fellowship. Over the years, there has been a Drill Team, the Golden Nuggets Choir, the Junior Ushers and now the Faith Choir and the Ensemble, an instrumental music group.

#### Youth Interests continued

The accomplishments of the First Baptist Youth Fellowship have shown that there is a positive outlook with hopeful expectations despite the fact that negative images sometimes seem prevalent. Among the youth projects have been after school tutoring, community clean up campaigns, mission outreach as well as an active recreational program which has included basketball, volleyball, softball and community trips in and out of town.

The Summer Enrichment Program/Daycamp has grown into one of the major undertakings of the church and includes a varied program of educational, recreational and even vocational activities such as gardening, crafts and job readiness training for teenagers.

Another facet of Rev. Bradley's leadership which will have long-lasting positive consequences is the promotion of the Scholarship Fund. Its continuous emphasis over the last 29 years has enabled First Baptist to help numerous students from the congregation attain financial assistance for their higher education endeavors.

#### MUSIC MINISTRY

"Serve the Lord with gladness: come before his presence with singing." This passage from Psalm 100:2 is a good example of how the music ministry has progressed at First Baptist over the past 29 years. Pastor Bradley constantly let his appreciation of good singing and music be known. Like many pastors, he seemed to have a very special interest and relationship with the various choirs. Through his support, the church continually upgraded the music staff as well as instruments such as a new piano, organ, keyboard and church sound system. A youthful Tim Bratton was hired as church organist in 1975 and later became Minister of Music. With the help of various other musicians, the music ministry now includes the Golden Nuggets, Faith Choir, Male Chorus, Voices of Joy and the Mass Choir. That singing aggregation has developed to one that is comparable to talented choirs all over the USA.

In earlier years at First Baptist at the 877 Udell location, the church was often referred to as "The Church With The Big Welcome. The Church With The Big Bell". A very large bell that originally came from a firehouse was erected on top of roof of the sanctuary. It was removed when the old sanctuary was demolished. After the new sanctuary was built, Sister Luima Burrus, a long-time member who had served in man offices and given of her time and talent particularly to the music department, had the idea of giving a gift that would be memorable and lasting. The Carillon can now be heard throughout the neighborhood on a daily basis as well as being played for special church occasions. It was donated by Mrs. Burrus' family, which includes her husband, Deacon Edward Burrus and her daughters Edith Holt and Clarice Bollen and other family members.

As is evident, the 29 year leadership that Rev. and Mrs. James R. Bradley have given the First Baptist, North Indianapolis congregation has been beneficial and loving. Rev. Bradley has kept First Baptist in close fellowship with other churches and religious organizations throughout the city, state and nation. He has encouraged continuous involvement with community entities such as the NAACP, United Way, United Negro College Fund and other non-profit organizations.

He has served in leadership positions with the Church Federation of Greater Indianapolis, and the Indiana Sunday School & Baptist Training Union Congress. Most of all, he has served a very diverse group of Christians at First Baptist. It is a congregation that comes from all parts of the city; it is a congregation from babies to senior citzens; it is a congregation from undeducated to highly educated; it is a congregation including the disabled and challenged to the healthy and blessed; it is a congregation of people with little wealth and few resources to people with some wealth and many resources; but to all of the congregation, he has many times preached about the

following verse: But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. Matthew 6:33

If you're looking for a history of First Baptist Church, a good starting place would be in the home of Naomi Taborn. Mrs. Taborn, who at 94 years old is the oldest living member of the church, has a home full of pictures, newspaper articles, anniversary programs, and other items commemorating church events. Not only does Mrs. Taborn have physical remembrances, she has personal memories from giving service to the church for 84 years, including 10 years as Rev. Bradley's secretary.

Mrs. Taborn's memories of Rev. Bradley's years of service are really too numerous to list; but some that have special significance to her are:

- the naming ceremony for F.F. Young Park on June 20, 1971. Rev. Bradley presided over the ceremony at which several city officials, church members and neighborhood residents attended.
- the groundbreaking ceremony for the new church on April 3, 1977.
- the church's 100th Anniversary celebration, for which she served on the anniversary committee and compiled the church's history.
- her retirement party held at the church in August 1977. More than 300 people attended.
- · the first joint men's and women's day service in September 1987.
- her many,many trips to all parts of the country representing First Baptist at conventions, congresses and for fellowshipping with other Christians.

After Mrs. Taborn retired, Mrs. Robertine Wells served as secretary for many years and in recent years Mrs. DeLois Watkins has served in that position.


