

Introduction

Our 85th Church Anniversary Commemorative Booklet will highlight reflections and insights from the fifty-two day Sabbatical journey completed by Pastor W. R. Goodner and his wife, Sis. Marcia Goodner in November, 2006. The Sabbatical was made possible through funds provided by Lilly Endowment's Clergy Renewal Program. The "Seven Churches of Revelation and the Footsteps of Paul" tour allowed the pastor time to renew his commitment to God and his God-appointed ministry, to reconnect with his family, and to explore and visit at a personal level the cities and countries where the early apostles ministered. The travel covered Turkey, Greece, Italy, Switzerland and USA (Boston, Massachusetts). During the journey, God's grace allowed our pastor and congregation to transform and continue in spiritual growth as we prepare for ministry in the 21st century.

Prayerfully, the sabbatical helped re-affirm the foundation on which our church was "divinely established",





Reflections from Pastor Goodner...My Experiences in Turkey, Patmos, and Greece

In September 2006, my wife and I were blessed to travel to Turkey, Greece and the Isle of Patmos as recorded in the Bible. We flew from Indiana to New York, New York to Ankara, Turkey and then on to Izmir, Turkey. This eighteen hour flight was the beginning of our journey to the Seven Churches of Revelation.

We spent ten days on a guided tour with a group of tourists visiting many historical places from Izmir to Rome, Italy. After the ten days were over we revisited sights in Turkey. We were able to see up close all of the cities where the seven churches in Revelation were located. We saw the place where the temple of Diana stood in the first century in Ephesus. The place historically where the riot broke out because of the success of the preaching of Paul and the workings of the Holy Spirit in Ephesus. There was a library also. At the time we were there they were preparing for a wedding on this very site. We moved from there to investigate the ruins of Smyrna (Izmir). There we saw for the first time in our lives a real live fig tree. From there we moved on to Pergamos where the worship of emperors was practiced. Moving from there we went to Sardis where we saw a gymnasium and a synagogue which were connected together. There was a temple dedicated to the pagan goddess Artemis. From Sardis we located Thyratira. We saw the ruins of a third or fourth century AD church. Church number six was the church of Philadelphia. This place had ruins of a church building of the third century AD. We saw some beautiful fruit growing inside the grounds as well as some colorful flowers. The last location was Laodecia. At this location all that remained was a few stones and many large fields covered with yellow grass.

We visited the Isle of Patmos. We were able to spend seven days in a rented apartment. There we rented a small car in order to get to downtown Skala. We held our own personal worship services selecting scriptures that spoke about Patmos and Saint John. We visited the monastery near our apartment where it is thought that John saw and wrote all of the contents

in the book of Revelation. Also on this island we ate some of the best tasting fish I had ever eaten. We had to our own laundry as well as do our own cooking in the apartment. The people on this island were very friendly.

We left this island and flew to Greece where we spent one week in Thessalonia and another week in Athens. In Thessalonia we hired a private taxi to carry us around. We attempted the same order that the mission group took when they arrived in Europe. We started in the city of Philippi and ended in the city of Corintth.

Reflections from Pastor Goodner (Continued)

We first went to Philippi where Paul, Silas, Luke and Timothy were used of the Lord to preach the Gospel and where Lydia and her household became the first converts in Europe. This is also the place where Paul and Silas were beaten, arrested, and delivered from jail by the power of God. The jailer and his household were converted from darkness to light. We saw the ruins of Thessalonia and a statue of Alexander the Great near the sea. Our taxi driver's name was Christos. He was very helpful in showing us around and explaining to us some of the customs of Greece. We moved on to Berea where there was an altar of Saint Paul, the place in the Bible where Luke explained that they received the word with readiness of mind and searched the scriptures daily to see if what Paul and Silas was preaching was so. We traveled on to Athens. There we saw the Acropolis, Agora, the Parthenon and Mars Hill. All of the sites in Athens were sights to behold. The last stop was Corinth. This is the place where this most problematic of the churches first resided. There were a few ruins there. The most noted place was the Bema Seat. There was also a temple of Zeus and other broken down temples decicated to other pagan gods.

It is my desire that many of my Christian brothers and sisters would have the same opportunity to visit these places mentioned in scripture because it will greatly enhance their teaching and ministry.

I love this passage of scripture. He formed you in your mother's womb! You are fearfully and wonderfully made, and created by the hand of the

Lord. How exciting to know that when God created you, He gave you specific gifts, talents and abilities that no one else shares but you. From the beginning of time, He knew that one day you would be faithfully serving Him... and married to a Pastorl And in His graciousness, He has equipped you for this very purpose and for this very season of your life. Our joy comes as we embrace the place that He has for us, even as a minister's wife. I had to remind myself of this fact continually on the sabbatical. God knew that Pastor Windford R. Goodner and wife would be blessed and take this marvelous journey. What a mighty God we serve. I was curious about the word sabbatical so I looked it up. I don't mean to bore you but please allow me to share—sabbatical means to break, retreat or an organized career break, agreed between staff and company where the individual is expected to return to their job. There are just some things I need to know and understand, thanks for indulping me.

Pastor Goodner has already shared his views concerning. I will approach our travel from a different angle placing emphasis on the people the Lord used to aid and assist us on our journey. Our travel included two phases, the first with a tour group, TourMagination, and phase two we were on our own. On the ten day tour with TourMagination we were blessed with a tour guide named Bulent, who was very knowledgeable about Turkish history, both ancient and modern. Bulent was our interpreter and our means of communicating in all situations. He purchased our tickets when necessary, communicated with our bus driver and the management in the restaurants we visited. On phase two of our tour we thought we were on our own. Oh but God was with us every step of the way.

I'll start in izmir, Turkey at the Otel (Hotel) Kaya Prestige which was a very nice hotel with a sweet maid named Rose. Rose was the sunshine in the day everyday. Our driver came and as we were about to get into the taxi, we discovered that he could not speak nor understand any English. Pastor Goodner was about to send him back home when the hotel desk clerk who was about to get off from work volunteered to go along with the driver and be our interpreter. Ali was

the best interpreter that we had during our whole week in Turkey. Yes, the clerk's name was Ali. He was very polite and had excellent manners. He explained to pastor that he could understand my English better than his. We took a photo of Ali eating a huge shrimp at one of the restaurants. On the second day, the pastor asked Ali and the rental car driver named Seth for directions to the five ancient cities of Revelation and for recommendations on which ones to see first. After about



15-20 minutes of discussion Ali and a friend gave us a plan that worked to our advantage. This is a photo of Seth six feet five inches in this tiny car being very patient and kind.

In Thessaloniki, Greece the Pastor was on his quest to find a driver for us. He found a driver by the name of Christophe, like Seth he was over six feet tall. He showed up in a Mercedes that

was about seven or eight years old. He spoke a little English. He shared some personal information: his daughter's name is Mia, she attends college in the US where she plays volleyball. He was a good driver and he purchased some delicious grapes for me. I love grapest Christophe's mother died while we were there. We expressed our concern for his loss and let him know we were praying for the family.

Christophe took us to the train station we headed to Athens. This trip to



Athens would be one that we would never forget. The train was packed, the train was packed!

A retired engineer, named George, was our angel of mercy. He and his wife were the only other
passengers in the coach which we were riding in. They spoke
English and could hold an understandable conversation with us.
They helped us get comfortable in the car, and organize a plan to

Church History

1919-1926 In 1919, Rev. Oits Steel began a mission at 1417 Roosevelt Ave. Five students were present at the first Sunday School. Eleven members were present for morning worship. The total offering was \$3.50.

On January 15, 1922, the mission was named Mt. Helm MBC. In 1924, a building was purchased at 16th & Alvord. The church grew and a larger building was secured at 17th & Yandes. In 1926, the choir was organized. Rev. Steel served as pastor until 1926.

- 1926-1927 The second pastor, Rev. McKnight, was called, and he served from 1926 to 1927.
- 1927-1935 The third pastor, Rev. F.K. Dillard, was called. The Missionary Society, BYPU, and Pastors Aid were organized. Rev. Dillard served from 1927 to 1935.
- 1935-1941 The fourth pastor, Rev. J.E. Barnhill, was called and he served from 1935 to 1941.
- 1941-1942 The fifth pastor, Rev. S.C. Richards, was called. The first Usher Board was organized. Rev. Richards served from 1941 to 1942.
- 1942-1977 The sixth pastor, Rev. W.D. Edwards, was called. He remodeled the church building. The church was paid off. The Trustee Board, Willing Workers, and Nurses Aid were organized. A new piano was purchased.

Rev. Edwards was a supporter of the District, State and National Convention. Twelve Deacons and eight ministers served under him. His tenure lasted 25 years, from 1942 to 1977, with his wife Alice by his side.

1978-2007 The seventh and current Pastor, Rev. W.R. Goodner, was called. He is a member of Friendship Baptist Church, in Cross Plains, TN.

Our Bible Study classes and Sunday School have grown. Two ministers and four deacons have been ordained under Pastor Goodner.

The lot at 1602 N. College Ave. was purchased for the sight of our new building. The groundbreaking ceremony was May 18, 1985. We marched into our new building on December 22, 1985.

In 1987, Mt. Helm hosted the First National Christian Fellowship for Missions. The purpose of this conference was to promote the love of Christ, no matter race or color.

In 1988, Rev. & Sis. Goodner learned that there is a Mt. Helm MBC in Jackson, MS, while enroute to Baton Rouge, LA. It is the oldest Black church in the country and gets its name from the family that donated the land for the church.

In 1990, a computer system was purchased. A sign was purchased and installed signifying Mt. Helm's new home.

Church History (continued)

1978-2007

April 21, 1991, marked our 69th Church Anniversary, and our comerstone was laid at that time. Several historic church items were contained.

In 1991, Mt. Helm independently began hosting VBS, after having previously alternated hosting with New Baptist.

In recent years, our Fellowship Hall was named to honor Rev. Edwards; the Library was named to honor Elder Henry S. Jones; the Nurses Room was named to honor Sis. Mary Coleman; the Church Clerks office was named to honor Sis. Pearlie Terry; and the Choir Room was named to honor Sis. Margaret Pearl.

On September 1, 1992, Rev. Goodner retired from Ford Motor Company, allowing him to pastor on a full-time basis.

In 1993, Rev. Goodner began his outreach mission to Ghana. Bibles, eyeglasses, and other necessities were sent with him. Our Mission Outreach has helped send several Ghanalan students through seminary school. Another objective was to establish a guest house in Ghana. The Ghana Guest House was completed in 2004. We are blessed to be able to continue to fund Rev. Goodner's mission to Ghana on a vearty basis to carry the good news of Christ.

On May 14, 1994, President Bill Clinton was in our city to dedicate MLK/Robert Kennedy Memorial in MLK Park. He delivered his weekly radio address from our church foyer.

In 1994, our outreach in the community joined with the Citizens Multi-Service Center to feed needy families. We also donated funds to The Children's Bureau, Noble Center, Sickle Cell Foundation, and Homes for Black Children, that we continue to support today.

In December 1995, we paid off our mortgage just 10 years after completion of our building. A mortgage burning ceremony was held in April, 1996. Greater Morning Star joined our celebration. Rev. Sterling Williams officiated.

In 1995, the Thursday night Bible Class was started for our youth, and was taught by Rev. William Groves, Jr., Youth Minister. The Youth Enhancement Period progressed to Youth Church in 1997. Our youth visit nursing homes, have youth fellowship outings, and attend the annual Sunday School Congress Convention.

In April 1997, the Mt. Helm Child Care Ministry opened, and was the first phase in the development of our ultimate education development center.

In April 2001, our church bus was dedicated and put into service for both the church and child care ministry.

The Youth Program was expanded in 2002, hosting Mr. Helm's first youth explosion. The Mt. Helm Steppers Drill Team was organized and kicked off in late 2002.

Our Ministries

This can include praying for and giving to missions, teaching principles and guidelines. conducting missions, learning and sharing information about various missions, developing spiritually toward a missions lifestyle, and participating in the work of the church.




