*Miss Me, But Let Me Go*

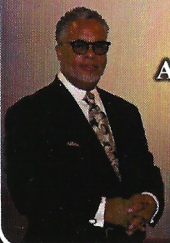
When I come to the end of the road

On Thursday, March 18, 2021, Charles William Tabor, father of two, was called to rest at age 96.

Charles William Tabor was born on September 10, 1924 in Kenton, Tennessee. Charles was the oldest child of Laura Williams and Chester Tabor and the first grandchild of William and Sophie Cole. Charles received Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior at an early age, and was baptized at St. Paul Church in Kenton.

Charles was educated in the St. Louis Public School System (Waring and Vashon High School). Charles entered the U.S. Navy in 1942 and reached the rank of Chief Petty Officer during his service during WWII. He was Honorably Discharged with several awards.

On April 8, 1951, he was united in Holy Matrimony to Patricia Ruth Hoffman at McPheeters Memorial Presbyterian Church. Mark Wesley and Courtney were born from this union.

Charles joined Christ Southern Missionary Baptist Church in 1935. He served under four Pastors. He served in many roles in the ministry. He was always finding ways to help and support others. This made him a well loved and respected member of the community. Charles was an entrepreneur and businessman who operated Hoffman's Upholstery.
