DEATH OF A PASTOR.

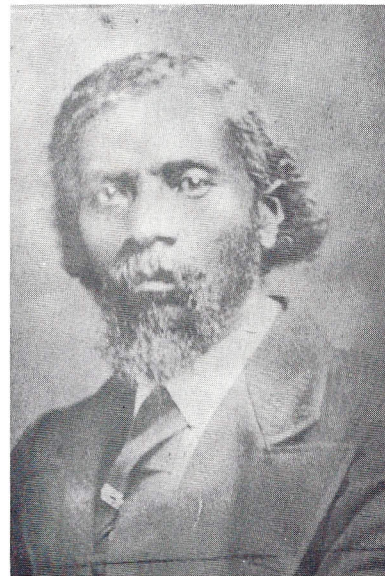
Pastor, thou art from us taken,

Rev. R. T. Huffman was called as pastor after the death of Rev. Lee. His pastorage was of short duration. Reports unbecoming for a minister were investigated. He treated the church with contempt. The church made protests to the General Association. After two years and one month of turmoil and dissatisfaction he resigned, October 1878.

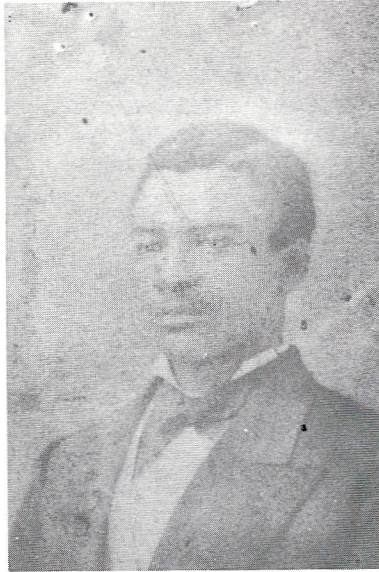

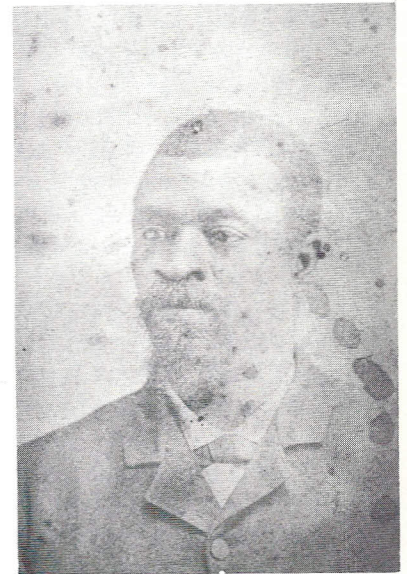
Rev. R. T. Huffman

Rev. J.R. Dudley
1880 - 1887

Rev J.R.Dudley was called in 1880. He began immediately to gather together the fragments of a bewildered membership. Under his efficient guidance the church moved forward, there was a rapid increase in membership. A happy and contented atmosphere prevailed. Spiritual and material progress was noted. After seven years of happiness under the leadership of this christian gentleman all felt dismayed on learning of his pending resignation. He resigned in 1887.

Rev E.J.Anderson was called to the pastorage of this church September 1887. He possessed an unusual voice for singing. Like the psalmist David, he was often referred to as, "the sweet singer of Israel." He used this rare gift to develop a choir second to none in the Blue Grass Region. During his pastorage more souls were added to the church than at any one during its entire history. After twelve years and six months, he resigned March 1898.

Rev. George M. Moore
1899 - 1904

Rev George M. Moore came to us from Main St., Baptist Church, Lexington, Kentucky. He accepted our call February 7, 1899. During his pastorage he endeared himself in the hearts of the membership. In his calm and unassuming manner he was able to accomplish great tasks with seemingly little efforts. The church enjoyed a period of peace and prosperity during his pastorage. He resigned September 11, 1904.

Rev. Rufus Henry Porter came to us from Staunton, Va., October 16, 1904. He was a scholarly christian gentleman. His wife, "Marjorie" was quite a helpmate. She organized the "Old Gold Sewing Circle," composed of all the women of the church. This group was instrumental in the installation of the "Memorial Windows," and a pipe-top organ. The membership increased to 600. After six years service he passed into the Great Beyond 1910. According to his request, "that he be buried where he last served," his remains lay in the cemetery on Hamilton Street, Georgetown, Kentucky.

A Rev. William Brown from Virginia was called April 8, 1910. Accepted the call. Made a visit and received money from the church to move. While awaiting his arrival, the church was surprised to receive his resignation, June 10, 1910. (Never an explanation)



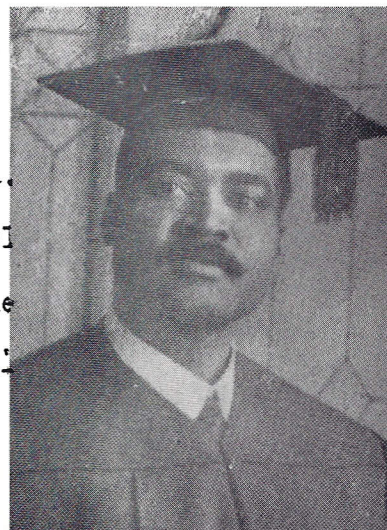
Rev. T. L. Ballou
1910 - 1912

Rev. Thomas L. Ballou came to us from Virginia Ave., Baptist church, Louisville, Ky. He was a student at Simmons University. He inspired within the membership a desire for intellectual advancement. After a period of nearly two years as pastor, he felt the urge to give full time to evangelistic work. He resigned August 25, 1912.



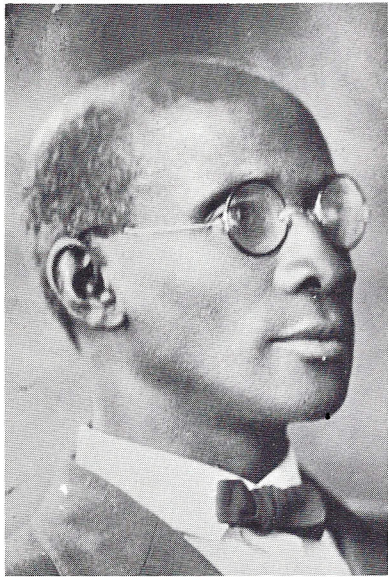
Rev. J. H. Parker

Rev. A. W. Nix, a student from Simmons University was called April 10, 1914. Was successful in building a great Sunday School. The church membership numbered 650. Lacking the qualities of a leader, he caused much worry and disagreement. He resigned September 28, 1918.

Disregarding the warning of Rev. T. Timberlake, Rev. Joseph H. Parker was called June 25, 1920. His teaching was contrary to Baptist doctrine. A great upheaval was experienced. The numerical strength of the church was greatly decreased. He resigned in 1921.

1921 - 1923

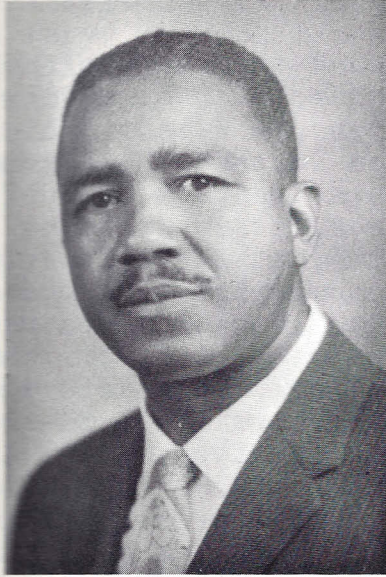
Rev. Edward H. Smith came to us from First Baptist Church, Winchester, Ky. in 1921. The Baptist ministers and congregations through out this section of the state were much concerned about the state of affairs as they existed in the First Baptist Church at Georgetown. A ministerial group recommended Rev. Smith because of his great knowledge and firm belief in the Baptist doctrine as well as his unusual ability as a leader. Realizing the disunity within the membership as a result of the recent "Parker incident" Like Nehemiah he looked over the field and began to work with a zeal. Testing the members willingness to work he requested that all members who desired to remain loyal to the church to register as such. He also asked for volunteer club leaders to sign up for a two-year period, "to help bring the church out of the wilderness." Again "calm" was brought out of a "storm." Many material improvements were made. The membership increased. Having accomplished the particular task for which he came - ie, to save the Church and the Baptist faith, he resigned in 1923.

Rev Harrison Nutter came to us from Cynthiana, Kentucky, He was licensed to preach in 1881 and ordained in 1882. He did not have the advantage of attending school, but by close observation and hard study of the Bible and other religious books he developed to the place where he was recognized as one of the best gospel preachers of his day. Rev. Nutter was called to this church twice. He accepted the first call but resigned without entering upon the work. The second call was extended in 1923. During his administration the interior of the church was redecorated, a panel ceiling was placed. The church built what is perhaps one of the finest church parsonages owned by Kentucky Negroes. During his twenty-four "calm" years of pastorage the church prospered.

He went to his Heavenly Home Dec. 18, 1947.

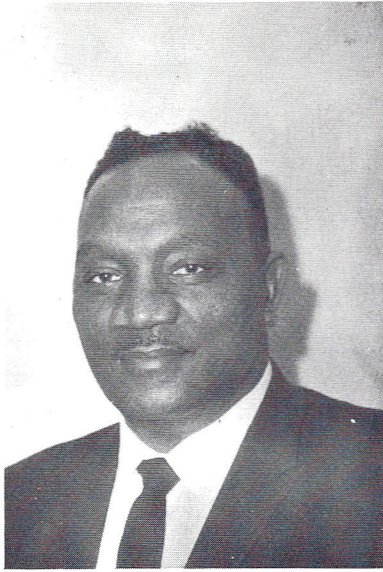
Rev. E. B. Dunbar
1948 - 1955

Rev. Elza Burton Dunbar was called as pastor in 1948. He was reared in Frankfort, Kentucky. Attended the schools of that city preparatory to entering Simmons University, Louisville, Kentucky. During his pastorage here he was successful in increasing the activities in all the church auxiliaries. He was instrumental in perfecting the first floor unit, the installation of a furnace, purchasing an electric organ, and erecting a brick garage. This is a partial list of his material achievements. He organized the Georgetown--Scott County Civic League which had possibilities for far reaching results. The spiritual progress was much for which to rejoice. He resigned in 1955.

Rev. William R. Brown came to us from New Hope Baptist Church, Ashland, Ky., in 1955. His preparation for life's service was done at Lincoln Institute, Lincoln Ridge, Kentucky; Blue Harmony Academy, Keyville, Va; Virginia Union University, Richmond, Virginia; West Virginia State College. He had done advance study at Moorehouse College, Atlanta, Georgia. The Minister has served as a member of the State Mission Board and President at large of the Baptist State Congress. With in the church material progress may be noted by the renovation of the auditorium, a new entrance, arrangement, traditional seating changed; new floor covering; built in choir stand with panel enclosure. An electric water fountain, flags, hymnals, Bibles, and book racks were purchased. From a spiritual and cultural aspect his contributions are beyond evaluation. He and his faithful companion, Mrs. K. H. Brown, worked untirengly for the betterment of the church and community. He left Georgetown with the blessings of the people who had learned to love him for his sterling Christian qualities and the life he lived among them. He resigned August 1961.

Rev Thomas D. Johnson was called to the pastorage of this church October 1961. A native of Ashland, Ky. he received his elementary education in the public school of that city. He is a graduate of Rust College, Holly Springs, Mississippi, and has done advance study at the University of Chicago. He is a member of New Hope Baptist Church, Ashland. Was ordained under the pastorage of Rev. W. R. Brown. Rev Johnson is a dynamic courageous minister. He and his gracious wife captivated the membership upon their arrival.

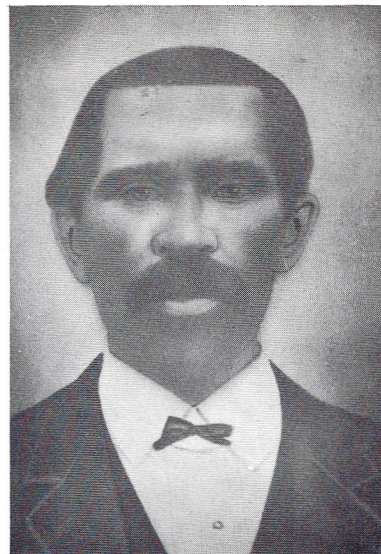
First Baptist Church has passed many milestones during its travels from 1851 to 1963, led by fifteen different ministers, it has had varying seasons of prosperity and adversities.

Rev. Harrison Turner was ordained in 1900. Attended Simmons Uni. Louisville, Ky.

Most of his ministerial work was done in Scott County.

Rev. Abraham Burley was ordained in 1900. He served in various capacities throughout the city and County.

Rev. Timothy Timberlake was ordained in 1900. Graduated from Simmons Uni. Pastored five churches. Served as State Evangelist for a number of years, presenting "Illustrated Sermons."

Rev Milton McIntyre was born in Wakeeney (Trego Co.) Kansas. Attended Simmons Uni. Ordained in 1914. Has supplied in many pulpits through out Scott County.

Rev. Lee McIntyre was ordained under the pastorage of Rev. A. W. Nix. A graduate of Simmons Uni. A pastor, evangelist, singer, and a friend to the friendless. At present he is the pastor of McFarland Baptist Church, Evansville, Indiana.

He received a Bachelor of Theology Degree from Simmons University, Louisville, Ky.

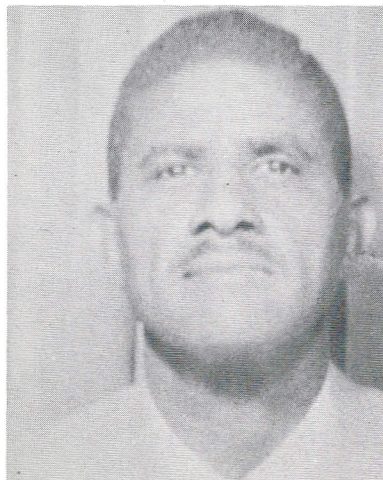
Dedicated to his high calling he is successfully pastoring Calvary Baptist Church, Haverstraw, New York.

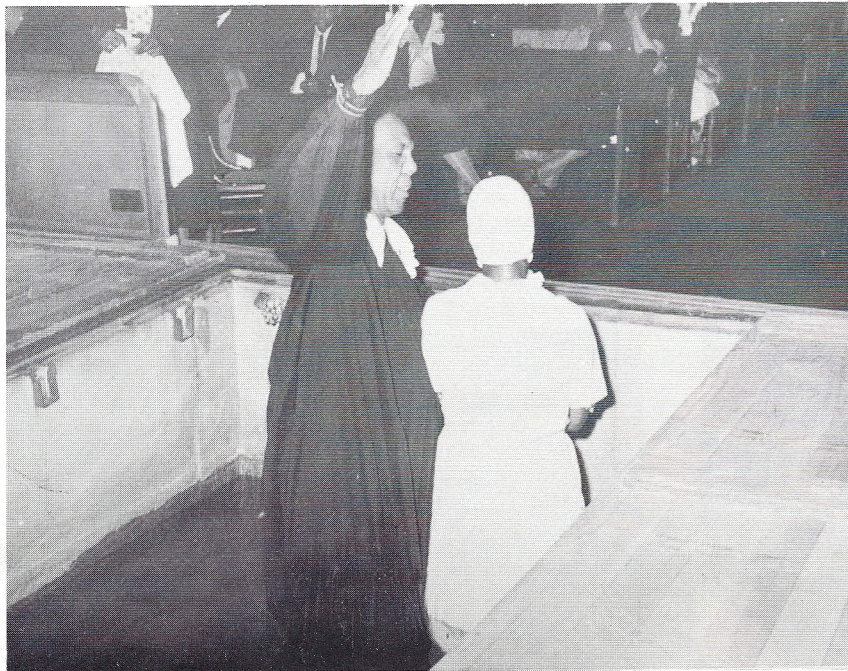

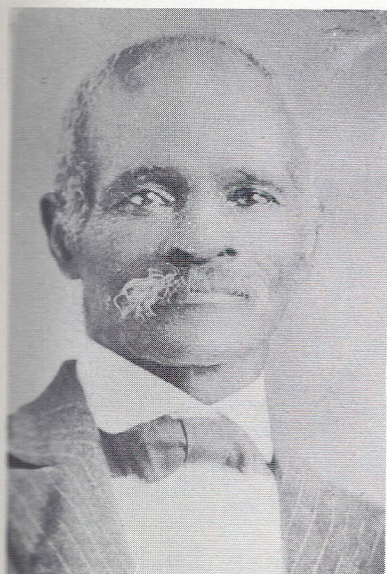


Rev.W.R.Brown baptising in the Church Baptistery.

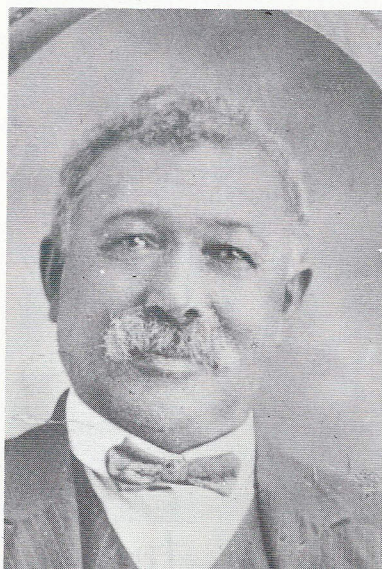
