Ten Guidelines For Church Etiquette

- 1 I will not walk, talk or distract anyone while Scripture is being read. Scripture, the Holy Bible, is God's divinely inspired Word. His word deserves the full attention of the church family. If I do not pay attention or if I distract someone else, not only may I miss a blessing but another member may miss theirs also.
- 2 I will not walk, talk or distract anyone while Prayer is going on. Prayer time is very important in the church. It is a divine priviledge that God has given His children. The clurch should be on one accord while a person is leading theyer. Talking to God is an important part of the Christian's life and we must take it seriously.
- 3 I will not walk, talk or distract anyone during the invitation. The Invitation to Christian Discipliship is the key montent during any worship service. It gives people the chance to respond to God's Word and give their lives to Christ. It is the most important decision a person can make in their life. The proper thing to do during the invitation is to Pray that someone will decide to give their life to Christ.
- 4 I will bring my Bible with me to Church and read it everyday. The Bible is God's Holy Word. As Christians, we are admonished to "Study to show mmyself approved". My Bible should become so much a part of me that not only will I carry it in my hand, but I will also carry it in my heart.
- 5 I will not leave church without receiving the Benediction. The Benediction is the final pronouncement and prayer for God's blessing upon the congregation until we meet again. How would I feel if God left me early before finishing what He was doing?
- i I will not take distracting news or messages to the Pastor before he has to preach on Sunday morning. In order to be fully used by God, a preacher must completely yield himself to the Holy Spirit. Distractions move him away from the preaching task. Trivial things should be kert until after the preacher has preached God's Word.
- 7 All written messages for the pulpit should be given to a Deacon, who will give the message to the pulpit. This helps to cut down on confusion during worship. The Deacons are the Pastor's right arm, and are responsible for seeing that the worship service proceeds without hindrances.
- 8 I will not walk through the Pulpit at anytime unless I am a preacher of the Gospel or am fulfilling some specified duty. The pulpit is a sacred place in God's house that is set aside for ministers or ones under the direction of the Pastor.
- 9 I will not lay foreign objects on the CommunionTable/Altar. The altar is a place of prayer, worship, sacrifice and communion. It is not meant for hats, coats, books, etc. We should respect God's altar
- 10 If I see my brother or sister practicing wrong church etiquette, I will go to them in a spirit of love and correct their mistake. Some people don't do better because they don't know any better.
