In recognition of his fine work, he was issued an honorary Doctor of Divinity Degree. During his life time he also worked at and retired from International Harvester. Doctor Thurman's church is located at 422 West Michigan Street in the city of Indianapolis.



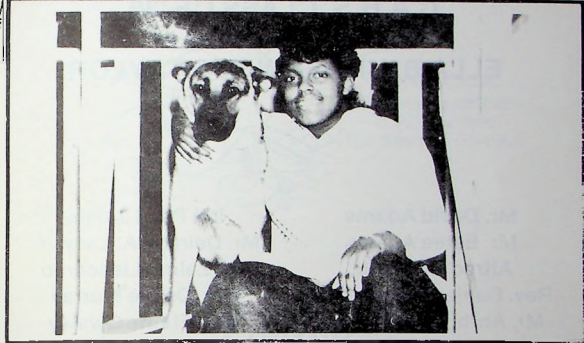

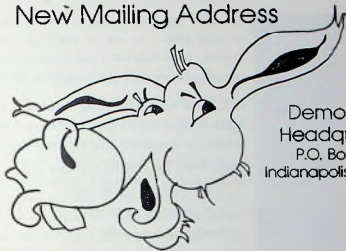

Lt. Col. DeBow enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corps in July 1941. As one of the five original Tuskegee Airmen, he completed flight school, and was commissioned as a second lieutenant in March 1942.

He served in the European Theatre during World War II, was promoted to Captain in 1943 and served as Commander of the 301st Fighter Squadron. He was discharged as a Captain in August 1945. From 1950-1978, he served in the United States Air Force Reserve with the 122nd Tactical Fighter Wing, and was retired in 1978 as a Lieutenant Colonel. His awards and decorations included: Air Medal, American Defense Service Medal, American Campaign Medal, European-African-Middle East Campaign Medal with three Campaign Stars, WWII Victory Medal, Air Force Longevity Service Award Ribbon.

Lt. Col. DeBow pursued his education at Butler University where he received his B.A. Degree in 1948, his M.S. Degree in 1953, and later received an Education Specialist Certificate. Lt. Col. DeBow was an exceptional educator serving as a secondary school teacher for many years - nine of which were at Kowe High School where he taught

English. He also taught Leadership and English at Fort Benjamin Harrison for years - and at I.U.P.U.I. for thirteen years - where he taught English, Biology, and Physics.

In 1984, he was presented the key to the City of Indianapolis - and was selected for the Legion of Hoosier Heroes by the Adjutant General of Indiana on September 8, 1984. He served as a Liaison Officer for the United States Air Force Academy, and was a member of the honorary educational fraternity, Phi Delta Kappa. He was recognized by President Reagan as one of the pioneers in aviation. He taught Sunday School for five years and was active in scouting. Four years ago, he affiliated with St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church.

Lt. Col. DeBow was born on February 13, 1918 and died on April 4, 1986. He is survived by his wife Aurelia Jane Stuart DeBow, seven children, and eleven grandchildren.
