blican challenger, Be Mukes-Gaither, 26,929 to 8,352. Ms. Mukes-Gaither is considered one of the better Republican can-didates, but she was running in a district that is overwhelmingly

The same could be said of Wade Stewart III and John Martin who ran against Crawford and Summers. The other winner who will once again join Crawford and Summers in the state legislature was John Day, the white Democrat.

House District 49 once again went Republican, leaving challengers Democratic Mae Dickinson and Fred Jackson loosers.

both parties when he called Watkins

a "token candidate."
Reuben "Pat" Patterson, Republican sheriff at the School 60 polling place, said he believed there was "no prejudice" involved in his party's decision to run Watkins.

"They found that no white candidate could beat Jacobs but I think Watkins' credentials were considered before his race." said Patterson, a black Republican who added that his vote for Watkins marked the first time he has opposed Jacobs since the congressman was elected in 1966.

Most blacks who voted at School 60 were Watkins supporters, he said.

When asked if he felt Watkins was a Republican vote-getting tool, Democratic voter Ephen Osborne said, "I don't doubt it, but I'm for any member of my own race.'

Glenn L. Howard, the City-County Council's Democratic minority leader, took a different look at the issue.

"The downtown power-structurepeople put money behind his campaign to justify to blacks that the Republicans are doing something great," he told a small group of Jacobs supporters outside School 60. "They should run blacks in marginal districts where white Republicans can also vote for black candidates."
